



Getting to Know the **Harlem** of **Ralph Ellison**

1. Open and save a Word document on the class website.
2. Save the file as your document named Harlem Poem - (Your last Name)
3. Print the poem "[Harlem](#)" by Walter Dean Myers
4. Listen and read poem: "Harlem" at this [Kennedy Center](#) website.

Using the Internet, create logical hyperlinks to the highlighted words so that others can find information more quickly and discover what you've learned. Getting you started: Locate websites that will help your classmates understand the significance of these words to Harlem and the IM. [Goree Island](#)

5. Go to [Drop Me Off in Harlem](#). Explore the site looking for information about the highlighted words in the poem.
6. Explore all three subsites:
 - a. [A Place Called Harlem](#)
 - b. [Faces of the Renaissance](#) (Visit at least three of the six professions listed)
 - c. [Themes and Variations](#)
7. After you've located a logical website, create the **Hyperlink**,
 - a. highlight the address of the webpage, right click and select "COPY"
 - b. toggle back to your Word document with the "Harlem" poem.
 - c. highlight the word you're linking
 - d. right click and select "Hyperlink"
 - e. click in the space "Type the file or web page name"
 - f. paste in the copied webpage address (Ctrl "V")
 - g. click OK. The pull down menu will close. You'll see the highlighted word underlined in blue.
 - h. verify that you'll hyperlinked the right page by double clicking on that blue word.
8. Save your page when you're finished each hyperlink.

You'll need to do additional web searches to locate other information to complete your section of the poem.
